LIVESTOCK EXHIBITOR CODE OF CONDUCT as Developed by OFAC (Ontario Farm Animal Council)

The West Niagara Fair is committed to responsible animal care and treatment. This Code of Conduct outlines what is expected of livestock exhibitors in the handling and exhibiting of all animals involved with our Fair and has been developed to meet the following objectives: To ensure the health and well being of all animals at the fair. To demonstrate an accurate and responsible animal care message to the public. To maintain the integrity of all livestock competitions, displays, and sales.

Livestock and poultry must be transported to and from the fair in accordance with all humane transport regulations and standards. Loading and unloading must be undertaken using proper equipment and procedures. All animals must be treated and handled in a responsible manner. The well being of the animals shall take precedence over the demands of owners, sellers, buyers, organizers, sponsors, and officials. The care of all animals must be as consistent as possible with their normal schedules and standards. High standards of nutrition, health, sanitation, environment and safety must be met at all times. All handling, housing and veterinary treatment must ensure adequate animal care. Livestock should be prepared with proper training, fitting and grooming prior to the fair. Excessive disciplining of animals at the fair is unacceptable. Exhibitors are expected to provide adequate training for anyone handling their livestock. Untrained individuals, including fair personnel and visitors, should not be permitted to handle animals or equipment. Exhibitors should take every opportunity to enhance public awareness, education and appreciation of proper livestock management and handling practices. There will be no tolerance for any mistreatment of animals. Any unacceptable exhibitor conduct will be subject to action including possible elimination from the competition(s) and/or exhibit, at the discretion of the Board.

We ask that all Exhibitors please register your entries ONLINE.

The Prize list is divided into "Sections", and under each Section are "Classes" listed by number.

Write down the Section # and Class# you wish to enter into.

Go to our website - www.westniagarafair.ca. Click on menu item West Niagara Fair, and find your class list. From there go to Prize Book -Online Entry.

Follow the directions and submit.

You will receive an email acknowledging your entries.

The sooner you register the sooner we can get your information and can send out the needed pass to get you through the gates the day of your show.

Free admission on the day of the show will be given to a registered Exhibitor, driver and two helpers.
All other passengers must pay regular admission.

EXHIBITORS MUST SUPPLY THEIR OWN STRAW

**Cattle exhibitors (except 4-H members) must submit written proof of liability insurance (\$1 million minimum) from insurance company, citing policy no. and expiry date, that indicates coverage of animals for fairs.
PROOF MUST BE PROVIDED WHEN MAKING ENTRIES.**

Additional Rules

1. An entry fee of 15% will be deducted from prize money won unless otherwise stated.
2. Cattle must remain on the grounds until 4 pm the day of the show. If any animal is taken from the grounds before specified times, the exhibitor of same may not be entitled to any prizes which may have been awarded.
3. All cattle must be purebred and be accompanied by a proper certificate of registration – NO PHOTOCOPIES.
4. Only one entry per class from a breeding unit, except the Fair may authorize, in up to two classes only, a maximum of two entries in Junior, Female, and Male Classes and a maximum of three entries in Senior Classes (2-year-old and up): maximum of 12 total eligible entries from a breeding unit exhibitors to allow 4-H calves to be shown by 4-H members in open classes. Such additional exhibits will not be eligible to compete in the Breeder's Herd Class and Get of Sire Class. All registered cattle whether owned by one person or by more than one person (individually or jointly) which are maintained on one farm or breeding unit, are considered to be the production of one farm or breeding unit.
5. If there are not three Exhibitors in any one Breed, the Committee has the right to change the grouping.
6. All entries must be owned by and registered in the name of the exhibitor.

- 100 Bull – Calf (born on or after Jan 1, 2022) Minimum of 3 months of age when judged.
101 Bull – born between Jan 1, 2021 and Dec 31, 2021
102 Bull – born between Jan 1, 2020 and Dec 31, 2020
103 Grand Champion Male – *Ribbon* and **SPECIAL: \$100 DONATED BY "THE BEEF FARMERS OF NIAGARA"** and Reserve Grand Champion Male – *Ribbon*
104 Female - Calf (born on or after Jan 1, 2022) Minimum of 3 months of age when judged.
105 Female – born between Apr 1, 2021 and Dec 31, 2021
106 Female – born between Jan 1, 2021 and Mar 31, 2021
107 Junior Champion Female – *Ribbon only* Reserve Junior Champion Female – *Ribbon only*
108 Female – born between Jan 1, 2020 and Dec 31, 2020 with her own 2022 natural, purebred, tattooed calf at foot.
109 Female – born prior to Jan 1, 2020 with her own 2022 natural, purebred, tattooed calf at foot
110 Senior Champion Female and Reserve Senior Champion Female – *Ribbons only*
111 Grand Champion Female – *Ribbon* and **SPECIAL: \$100 DONATED BY "THE BEEF FARMERS OF NIAGARA"** and Reserve Grand Champion Female – *Ribbon*

Prizes for Class 112-114: 1st\$50 2nd\$40 3rd\$20 4th\$10 unless indicated otherwise

- 112 **Get of Sire** – A group of three animals from the same sire, both sexes represented. At least one animal owned by the exhibitor. Animals must be shown in previous class.
113 **Progeny of Dam** – a group of two animals from the same dam, either sex. One animal must be owned by the exhibitor. Animals must be shown in previous class
114 **Breeder's Herd** – A group of four animals both sexes represented, must be exhibited in one of the above classes. At least one animal must be owned by the exhibitor.
