WHAT IS 4-H?

4-H is one of Canada's longest running youth organizations for young people between the ages of 9 and 21. 4-H is a grassroots organization of **leaders building leaders**. 4-H emphasizes the importance of looking at the big picture; that youth need to see beyond themselves and focus on how their actions affect their relationships, their community, the environment and society as a whole. This belief is reflected in the 4-H pledge, said at the beginning of every 4-H meeting and event. The 4-H pledge encourages a balanced lifestyle (intellectual, emotional, physical and spiritual), and reminds participants to aim to be a good friend, mentor, community member and citizen.

4-H is based on a "**Learn to Do by Doing**" philosophy. Members and volunteer leaders come together to create a 4-H club, where members learn about a selected topic through hands-on activities and mentorship. 4-H gives youth opportunities to learn new things through a dedicated group of volunteer leaders. 4-H youth learn the skills needed to contribute to making this a better world. Many of them go on to become leaders in their communities.

Scholarships are available to current members of Niagara 4-H who have completed at least six projects and are going on to attend a recognized post-secondary education program with a minimum duration of 12 weeks. There will be three (3) scholarships awarded annually. The amount of these scholarships will be \$1000; \$500.00; and \$\$250.00. All other gualified applicants will receive \$100.

- 3. Exhibitors may be from any 4-H project since Sep 1, 2022.
- 4. No entry fee is required.
- 5. Club name shall be used in the display.
- 6. Display should be set up by club members.
- 7. Exhibits will be evaluated and given ribbons for Groups A, B and C. Each club will receive \$15.00 for entering. The best overall exhibit will receive an additional \$5.00.
- All exhibits are to be set up in the designated area by 9 pm on Wednesday before fair. Table space for each display (3' x 4') will be available. Exhibits must remain on display until 5 pm on Sunday and removed immediately thereafter.
- 9. The West Niagara Agricultural Society is not responsible for lost or stolen articles.



POLICY ON LIVESTOCK AT THE WEST NIAGARA FAIR

Exhibitors entering animals, shall agree to have any animal or animals examined by a certified Vet at the request of the director in Charge.

In the interest of maintaining a high standard of animal health, all livestock are subject to inspection upon arrival. If evidence of an infection or contagious disease is discovered, the owner of the infected animals shall be required to remove it from the premise immediately.

Abuse of animals contrary to the Recommended Code of Practice's will not be tolerated. The wellbeing of the animals take priority over the demands of the owner. Any violation of this rule will result in immediate disciplinary action.

All Livestock/equine exhibitors must provide proof of insurance with policy number, name of insurance company and expiry date on entry forms.
