LIVESTOCK EXHIBITOR CODE OF CONDUCT as Developed by OFAC (Ontario Farm Animal Council)

The West Niagara Fair is committed to responsible animal care and treatment. This Code of Conduct outlines what is expected of livestock exhibitors in the handling and exhibiting of all animals involved with our Fair and has been developed to meet the following objectives: To ensure the health and well being of all animals at the fair. To demonstrate an accurate and responsible animal care message to the public. To maintain the integrity of all livestock competitions, displays, and sales.

Livestock and poultry must be transported to and from the fair in accordance with all humane transport regulations and standards. Loading and unloading must be undertaken using proper equipment and procedures. All animals must be treated and handled in a responsible manner. The well being of the animals shall take precedence over the demands of owners, sellers, buyers, organizers, sponsors, and officials. The care of all animals must be as consistent as possible with their normal schedules and standards. High standards of nutrition, health, sanitation, environment and safety must be met at all times. All handling, housing and veterinary treatment must ensure adequate animal care. Livestock should be prepared with proper training, fitting and grooming prior to the fair. Excessive disciplining of animals at the fair is unacceptable. Exhibitors are expected to provide adequate training for anyone handling their livestock. Untrained individuals, including fair personnel and visitors, should not be permitted to handle animals or equipment. Exhibitors should take every opportunity to enhance public awareness, education and appreciation of proper livestock management and handling practices. There will be no tolerance for any mistreatment of animals. Any unacceptable exhibitor conduct will be subject to action including possible elimination from the competition(s) and/or exhibit, at the discretion of the Board.

We ask that all Exhibitors please register your entries ONLINE.

The Prize list is divided into "Sections", and under each Section are "Classes" listed by number.

Write down the Section # and Class# you wish to enter into.

Go to our website – www.westniagarafair.ca. Click on menu item West Niagara Fair, and find your class list.

From there go to Prize Book - Online Entry.

Follow the directions and submit.

You will receive an email acknowledging your entries.

The sooner you register the sooner we can get your information and can send out the needed pass to get you through the gates the day of your show.

English warm up begins at 8:30am & ends promptly at 9:15 am – check back for start time for Western Classes

Free admission on the day of the show will be given to a registered Exhibitor, and one driver or helper. All other passengers must pay regular admission. Any attendee who wishes to dispute admission charged is asked to do so at the Fair office, not at the Show Entry booth.

THIS IS AN OPEN SHOW – All competitors are welcome.

Additional Rules:

1. All entries are to be made at the Show Office ½ hour prior to the show start time. Entries can be made online prior to show date.

ALL EXHIBITORS MUST PAY EXHIBITOR FEE OF \$10. One free pass to the Fair is included when fee is paid.

2. This show will be following WHAO show rules for the western classes and halter. Equine Canada rules will pertain to English classes. Please be aware of the rules as they are outlined in the rule book. There will be a rule book available show day if questions or concerns arise. This is not a POINT show.

3. Exhibitors of horses (4H exhibitors exempt) must submit written proof of insurance recording policy # and expiry date showing a limit of minimum \$1 million and coverage for showing animals at fairs or exhibitions and for the duration of the Fair. This proof must be provided at the time of making your entries. No exceptions! "OEF" membership card is preferred. 4H exhibitors are covered by their association.

4. **Entry fees: ALL CLASSES \$10 per entry.**

5. Youth: 18 years of age and under as of Jan. 1, 2023. Youth are required to wear CSA approved helmets where appropriate. Helmets are strongly encouraged for ALL.
