All exhibitors must abide by the GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR ALL EXHIBITORS as posted on our website www.westniagarafair.ca

All exhibitors (excluding 4-H) must provide written proof of liability insurance of \$1 million minimum citing policy number and expiry date, that indicates coverage of animals for fairs.

All new exhibitors must pay their exhibitor fee to the Chairperson (Joanne) before the start of the show.

- The Prize list is divided into “Sections”, and under each Section are “Classes” listed by a number.
- Write down the Section # and Class# you wish to enter.
- Go to our website – www.westniagarafair.ca. Click on the menu item *The Fair*, and scroll down to *Livestock Prizebooks* to find your class list. From there, you may scroll down to *Enter Here* or, enter by following the bolded link above.
- Follow the directions and submit.
- You will receive an email acknowledging your entries.

The sooner you register, the sooner we can get your information and can send out the required pass to get you through the gates on the day of your show.

Additional Rules:

- Entry fee is 15 % of prize money unless otherwise stated.
- Goats must be on the grounds in their pens no later than 9:00 am on Saturday Sept 7th in order that tattoos and registration certificates may be checked.
- There will be a pre-show veterinary inspection which all animals must pass. The inspection will be at 9:30am.
- All goats may leave the grounds at 5 pm. If any animal is taken from the grounds before specified time, the exhibitor of same may not be entitled to any prizes which may have been awarded.
- The base date for calculating the age of an animal to be shown is Sep 1, 2024.
- Exhibitor signs should be displayed.
- There will be no pre-show milk out. A doe with a hard, distended udder will be disqualified at the discretion of the Judge.
- Exhibitors are requested to be neatly and appropriately attired when showing their animals in the ring.
- The maximum total eligible exhibits from a breeding unit are 10 head. Up to three animals from a breeding unit may be shown in two classes, otherwise only two exhibits per breeding unit are allowed in each class, up to the maximum.

Breed Sections:

19A=Alpine 19D= Nigerian Dwarf 19N=Nubian 19O=Any other Purebred 19R=Recorded Grade

For example: Section 19A Class 100 = Alpine, Doe Kid >3 <9 mos

Classes

- 100 Doe Kid: over 3 months & under 9 months, never freshened.
101 Doe Kid: over 9 months & under 24 months, never freshened.
102 Milking Yearling: over 12 months & under 24 months, in milk.
103 Doe: over 24 months & under 36 months, in milk.
104 Doe: over 36 months, in milk.

GRAND AND RESERVE GRAND CHAMPION- Certificates

Prizes for classes 105 - 106: 1st \$35 2nd \$30

- 105 Best Udder Class: Judging shall designate the best two udders in each of the milking classes. These designated exhibits shall compete for 1st and 2nd places only.
106 Breeder's Herd: a group of four animals (bred and owned by the exhibitor), consisting of at least three milking does.

LIVESTOCK EXHIBITOR CODE OF CONDUCT as Developed by OFAC (Ontario Farm Animal Council)

The West Niagara Fair is committed to responsible animal care and treatment. This Code of Conduct outlines what is expected of livestock exhibitors in the handling and exhibiting of all animals involved with our Fair and has been developed to meet the following objectives: To ensure the health and well being of all animals at the fair. To demonstrate an accurate and responsible animal care message to the public. To maintain the integrity of all livestock competitions, displays, and sales.

Livestock and poultry must be transported to and from the fair in accordance with all humane transport regulations and standards. Loading and unloading must be undertaken using proper equipment and procedures. All animals must be treated and handled in a responsible manner. The well being of the animals shall take precedence over the demands of owners, sellers, buyers, organizers, sponsors, and officials. The care of all animals must be as consistent as possible with their normal schedules and standards. High standards of nutrition, health, sanitation, environment and safety must be met at all times. All handling, housing and veterinary treatment must ensure adequate animal care. Livestock should be prepared with proper training, fitting and grooming prior to the fair. Excessive disciplining of animals at the fair is unacceptable. Exhibitors are expected to provide adequate training for anyone handling their livestock. Untrained individuals, including fair personnel and visitors, should not be permitted to handle animals or equipment. Exhibitors should take every opportunity to enhance public awareness, education and appreciation of proper livestock management and handling practices. There will be no tolerance for any mistreatment of animals. Any unacceptable exhibitor conduct will be subject to action including possible elimination from the competition(s) and/or exhibit, at the discretion of the Board.
