All exhibitors must abide by the GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR ALL EXHIBITORS as posted on our website www.westniagarafair.ca

All exhibitors (excluding 4-H) must provide their Ontario Equestrian Federation Number or written proof of liability insurance of \$1 million minimum citing policy number and expiry date, that indicates coverage of animals for fairs.

- The Prize list is divided into “Sections”, and under each Section are “Classes” listed by a number.
- Write down the Section # and Class # you wish to enter.
- Go to our website – www.westniagarafair.ca. Click on the menu item *The Fair*, and scroll down to *Livestock Prizebooks* to find your class list. From there, you may scroll down to *Enter Here* or, enter by following the bolded link above.
- Follow the directions and submit.
- You will receive an email acknowledging your entries.

The sooner you register, the sooner we can get your information and can send out the required pass to get you through the gates on the day of your show.

All livestock exhibitors are entitled to two free admissions at the gate (exhibitor +1) upon payment of their \$10 exhibitor fee, which is to be paid directly to the Committee Contact on the day of the event. Any attendee who wishes to dispute admission charges is asked to do so at the Fair office, not at the Show Entry booth.

Additional Rules:

- Entry fee is \$10 per class unless otherwise stated.
- This show will be following WHAO show rules for the western classes and halter. Equine Canada rules will pertain to English classes. Please be aware of the rules as they are outlined in the rule book. There will be a rule book available show day if questions or concerns arise. This is not a POINT show.
- Youth 18 years of age and under as of Jan. 1, 2024. Youth are required to wear CSA approved helmets where appropriate. **Helmets are strongly encouraged for all.**
- English Riders must choose a division to compete in (2' 3", 2' or 18").
- Riders are permitted to do their division + Hack.

LIVESTOCK EXHIBITOR CODE OF CONDUCT as Developed by OFAC (Ontario Farm Animal Council)

The West Niagara Fair is committed to responsible animal care and treatment. This Code of Conduct outlines what is expected of livestock exhibitors in the handling and exhibiting of all animals involved with our Fair and has been developed to meet the following objectives: To ensure the health and well being of all animals at the fair. To demonstrate an accurate and responsible animal care message to the public. To maintain the integrity of all livestock competitions, displays, and sales.

Livestock and poultry must be transported to and from the fair in accordance with all humane transport regulations and standards. Loading and unloading must be undertaken using proper equipment and procedures. All animals must be treated and handled in a responsible manner. The well being of the animals shall take precedence over the demands of owners, sellers, buyers, organizers, sponsors, and officials. The care of all animals must be as consistent as possible with their normal schedules and standards. High standards of nutrition, health, sanitation, environment and safety must be met at all times. All handling, housing and veterinary treatment must ensure adequate animal care. Livestock should be prepared with proper training, fitting and grooming prior to the fair. Excessive disciplining of animals at the fair is unacceptable. Exhibitors are expected to provide adequate training for anyone handling their livestock. Untrained individuals, including fair personnel and visitors, should not be permitted to handle animals or equipment. Exhibitors should take every opportunity to enhance public awareness, education and appreciation of proper livestock management and handling practices. There will be no tolerance for any mistreatment of animals. Any unacceptable exhibitor conduct will be subject to action including possible elimination from the competition(s) and/or exhibit, at the discretion of the Board.
